Common Names: Coconut Palm, Niu

Plant Characteristics

Duration: Perennial, Evergreen

Growth Habit: Tree

Hawaii Native Status: Introduced. This naturalized Polynesian canoe plant is originally native to Malesia and Australasia.

Flower Color: Yellowish green, Creamy yellow

Flowering Season: Year-round

Height: Up to 100 feet (30 m) tall, but usually less

Kingdom: Plantae – Plants
